We are recruiting Placement Hosts to facilitate placements and develop inclusive workplace cultures and remove barriers for graduates with disabilities. Leonard Cheshire will fully reimburse all Placement Hosts so you can pay the Living Wage to your Graduate for the duration of their placement.

According to latest figures in Northern Ireland, just

38%

of people with disabilities are employed compared to 80.3% of people without disabilities. Those aged 16-24 are the worst affected group. * Our disability employment gap is consistently

higher

than the rest of the UK at 42.2pps, compared to 27.9pps for the whole of the UK.*

Key Information:

- Leonard Cheshire will pay you for the total cost of the placement and you are asked to administer through your payroll system
- It is recommended to provide the graduate with a contract
- We ask that you make any adjustments or allowances to accommodate their disability or condition (we can support any financial costs)
- We ask that you provide a practice interview at the end of the placement (we do not require that there is an actual job!)
- The graduate will also be asked to attend 12 half day online business learning workshops during their placement hours and to be released for a graduation event on 29th June.
- Graduates are aware that some placements will be office based, some home based, and some will be a hybrid working model. It would be ideal if a graduate can get some time in an office to give more access to learning/teamwork/office practice.
- Type of work is flexible but we suggest a mixture of a project to work on their own, contribution to weekly admin and some job shadowing.
